Nashville Attractions

Nashville is mostly known as Music City and many of its attractions are related to the music industry that calls Nashville home. Here are just a few of the many music related attractions in Nashville: Grand Ole Opry, Country Music Hall of Fame, Ryman Auditorium, Tennessee Performing Arts Center, Music City Walk of Fame, Fontanel Mansion (former home of Barbara Mandrell), and many others.

Other attractions include: Tennessee State Museum, Military Branch of the Tennessee State Museum, Tennessee State Capitol, General Jackson Showboat and the Parthenon.

Transportation

Nashville International Airport provides service from many of the major airlines. The list of airlines serving Nashville include: American, American Eagle, American Connection, Continental, Delta, Delta Connection, Frontier, Southwest, United Express, US Airways, US Airways Express, Air Canada, and Branson Air Express.

Nashville is readily accessible using the Interstate Highway system. The Interstate Highways intersecting in Nashville are: I-40 (East-West), I-24 (Northwest to Southeast), and I-65 (North-South).

Proximity to Military Installations

There are only two military installations in Tennessee, Navy Mid South and Arnold AFB. Neither of these bases are near enough to Nashville to use their facilities. Fort Campbell, Kentucky is approximately 60 miles northwest on the Tennessee-Kentucky state line. Fort Campbell is too far to consider for any reunion functions.
